INCIDENT TYPE – CRIMINAL HOMICIDE IN THE 200 BLK OF DRUID ST

HIGH POINT, NC – On Thursday, May 23, 2019 at approximately 2:00 am, High Point Police Officers responded to the 200 block of Druid St after receiving reports of shots fired in the area. Officers arrived in the area and located a vehicle in the parking lot of a small apartment complex in the 200 block of Druid St occupied by a single male victim.

High Point Police detectives are still conducting an active investigation into this incident. During this investigative process detectives will continue to conduct interviews of potential witnesses and involved parties, conduct searches of any people, vehicles or places that may contain evidence of the crime and collect any other relevant materials that may aid in investigation or prosecution. For those reasons, no additional information will be released at this time related to this incident which includes any victim/suspect information and details specific to the active investigation. Updated information will be provided as soon as reasonable at the appropriate time.

INCIDENT UPDATE – MAY 23, 2019

Investigating detectives have identified **Cameron N Owens B/M 23 of Greensboro** as the victim from this morning's homicide. At this time The High Point Police Department will not be releasing investigative details relevant to this investigation as detective work to identify and speak with any person(s) involved and search for evidence related to the crime.

INCIDENT UPDATE – July 17, 2019 (SUSPECT ARRESTED)

After further investigation, High Point Police Detectives were able to establish probable cause and identify **Bryce D Stanback B/M 25 of High Point** as a suspect in the May 23, 2019 homicide of Cameron Owens. Stanback was arrested on July 17, 2019, at approximately 10:30 am without incident by members of the High Point Police Department Street Crimes Unit and the United States Marshalls Fugitive Task Force and charged with 1st-degree Murder. Stanback was confined to the Guilford County Jail (High Point) under no bond.

As a violent chronic offender, **Bryce D Stanback** was called in and notified of his Violent Crimes Task Force status previously by the High Point Police Department. This involves police and state and federal prosecutors notifying violent offenders that any future crimes they commit will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law, to include maximum prison time. Then, offenders are offered a variety of community resources through High Point Community Against Violence (HPCAV) to help them change their lifestyles and to stop committing violent crimes. The High Point Violent Crimes Task Force was created to improve the quality of life for the residents of High Point by reducing violent crime, using a comprehensive, collaborative data-driven strategic approach involving federal, state, and local resources to identify violent, repeat, and/or group offenders, and employ prevention and intervention techniques to stop the violence.



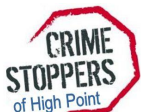
