INCIDENT TYPE – SIX PEOPLE ARRESTED DURING CRIME SUPPRESSION PROJECT

HIGH POINT, NC – High Point officers arrested six people, and seized illegal firearms and drugs during a recent Crime Suppression Project.

The High Point Police Department’s Street Crimes Unit led the project from December 19-22. The project focused on individuals involved in violent crime and drug activity in High Point.

The project resulted in:

- Arrests: 6
- Firearms Seized: 4
- Methamphetamine Seized: More than 1,000 grams
- Heroin Seized: .78 grams
- Marijuana Seized: 17 grams
- U.S. Currency Seized: \$1,195

The project included officers from the High Point Police Department’s Street Crimes Unit, Strategic Intelligence Unit, Traffic Unit and patrol teams.

More information on the arrests made during this project is below.

On December 19, 2023, officers arrested four people, including one juvenile.

At about 2:35 p.m., a detective attempted to stop a vehicle with a fictitious license plate. The vehicle sped off but was spotted again several hours later. Detectives attempted another traffic stop near Piedmont Parkway and Guilford College Road when the driver rammed several unmarked police vehicles.

Detectives stopped the vehicle, which was reported stolen out of Charlotte. Officers arrested the driver, **Khristian L. Robbins (B/M, 21)**. When officers searched the passengers, they found

drugs. **Aaron Hughes Jr.** had 117 grams of methamphetamine and a **juvenile** was in possession of marijuana and heroin. Detectives also seized more than \$1,100 in cash.

Following the traffic stop, officers went to an apartment in the 3000 block of Sherrill Avenue. Detectives conducted a knock and talk and applied for a search warrant. During the search warrant, officers found two handguns and a 7.62 caliber Draco rifle. One of the firearms was reported stolen out of Fayetteville. Detectives also seized an additional 940 grams of methamphetamine from the home.

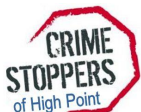

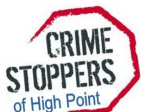
